Parental Engagement

This year our school will continue to follow the partnership work put in place as part of the Achievement for All project and further developed during the implementation of the new SEN Code of Practice in 2014, with the aim of raising the aspirations, access and achievement of our children.

Parental engagement is at the heart of this work. We aim to:

- Develop an effective, supportive relationship between the teacher and parent.
- Establish a culture of listening, rather than telling.
- Celebrate successes, share concerns, identify barriers to learning and agree shared aspirations.
- Clarify the most effective means of communication.
- Sets clear goals and targets for learning and improvement in wider outcomes, such as behaviour, friendships, self-esteem or attendance.

- Determine activities and strategies which will help the children to achieve their targets.
- Identify the responsibilities of teacher, parent and child in this process.

Targeted Intervention (Support Staff)

Interventions led by Learning Support Assistants and Higher Level Teaching Assistants include:

- Before school- gross and fine motor skills sessions.
- Literacy and maths booster group sessions for KS1 and KS2.
- 1 to 1 literacy and maths support
- 1 to 1 and small group Social, Emotional and Mental Health support, e.g. friendship groups, self-esteem, anxiety, anger management, transition.

Targeted intervention (Teachers)

Interventions led by teachers include:

- Challenging the more able, e.g. developing writing.
- Writing intervention in Key Stage 1.
- Reading intervention in Key Stage 1.

Subsidised off site learning experiences

- Pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium are offered subsidised places on school learning experiences.
- Year 6 residential subsidy.

Subsidised extended schools / extra curricular activities

Pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium are offered subsidised places on those extra curricular activities for which there is a charge. For example music tuition, Karate, Football, Basketball, Hockey, Cross Country and Megacamps holiday club.

Purchase of specific resources to support individual children

Early Help and Family Support Service

EHFSS provide support and challenge for children and their families. The team use an integrated approach using targeted interventions in order to improve school attendance and/or improve outcomes for children and families.

Play Therapy and Individual Counselling

When necessary, Pupil Premium may be used to buy-in the services of a professional counsellor to support eligible pupils with emotional issues.

Educational Psychologist

Pupil Premium may be used to support eligible pupils by buying-in additional support from the Educational Psychologist to give advice on academic or behavioural needs.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2016/17

Raising achievement in Reading, Writing and Mathematics is an over-arching desired outcome for all pupils in our School Development Plan. We aim to ensure that Pupil Premium Grant eligible children make progress at least in line with National Expectations for all pupils.

The Pupil Premium Grant will also be used to improve wider outcomes for all eligible pupils, i.e. social and emotional development and attendance.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of each program of intervention. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.

Individual pupil attainment and achievement will be tracked on a termly basis.
